In addition, toiletries such as toilet paper, shampoo, soap, toothpaste, and toothbrushes are regularly requested. Lastly, it is very useful to have items available now that the weather is cold - gently used blankets, jackets, hooded sweatshirts, hats, gloves, and socks.
