Dear Faithful Parishioners of the Church of St. Mary,

I recently had the good fortune of concelebrating a wedding that was beautiful, prayerful and joyful. At the reception, one of the readers at the Wedding Mass shared with me her journey of faith, being baptized in another faith tradition, marrying a Catholic, raising her children Catholic and reflecting on the opportunity of converting to the Catholic faith. After the joyous celebration of marriage of her dear friends, she complemented the priest who presided at the wedding, and commented, "I would convert today if you were my pastor!" 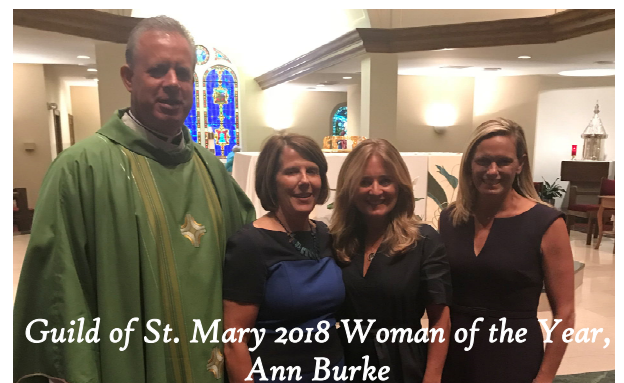

Highlights 2018-2019

- Kindergarten classes were added to the program this year, Bibles were given out to children in 4th & 5th grade, 7th graders attended the Archdiocese Holy Fire retreat and 8th graders participated in a new Confirmation retreat.
- *Breakthrough Bibles*, published by St. Mary's Press, were presented to students in 4th and 5th grades. These unabridged Bibles were selected because of their child friendly readability and illustrations.
- Students learn faith concepts through prayer, Scripture, and works of mercy. Lessons include a variety of activities including Catholic art, illustrations, vocabulary, media, and prayers.
- St. Mary's Religious Education program supports parents as the first educators of the Faith. Family catechesis was provided through sacramental preparation meetings, Reconciliation and First Communion retreats for parents and children, as well as a 7th grade service meeting and an 8th grade Confirmation meeting for parents, sponsors, and students. Additionally, Advent and Lent resources were provided for home prayer and reflection.
- Parents were also invited to participate in prayer services, Open Houses, and special events.

Children's Liturgy of the Word

- Children's Liturgy of the Word is offered throughout the school year, at the 10:00am Sunday Mass for all children of the parish ages 4 yrs old through 5th grade.
- Trained catechists lead these sessions to help our young ones understand and relate to the Sunday Scriptures as well as the Liturgical Calendar.

Vacation Bible School

76 Children | 10 Catechists | 22 Student Aides

- During the summer, children ages 4 to 10 participated in a fun-filled week of Vacation Bible School.
- The theme this year focused on prayer.
- Through activities based on travel to other countries, the children learned how to pray and the importance of praying through the ups and downs of life and taking time to refuel our faith.

Highlights 2018-2019

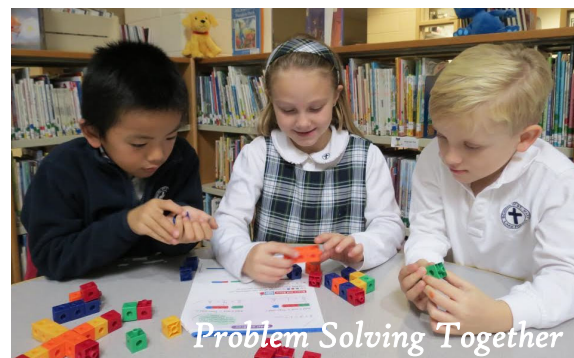
- 6th graders received *Chromebooks* along with 7th and 8th graders at the UGC, as the school continues to expand our 1-to-1 laptop initiative.
- Continued expanding school communication efforts through social media along with weekly newsletters.
- Continued to grow and expand Liturgical offerings. Faculty and students prayed the Holy Rosary every Friday in October and celebrated the Stations of the Cross throughout Lent. The School continues to pray daily, take part in community service efforts, and raise funds for the less fortunate. Students took part in Reconciliation during Advent and Lent. 2nd grade students received the Sacraments of Reconciliation and First Communion while the 8th graders became Confirmed members of the Catholic Church. Not only do the students continue to grow academically and physically, but spiritually, morally and emotionally as well.
- Accentuating and recognizing the positive actions and deeds of the students through *Crusader Commendations* and *Random Acts of Kindness Week*.
- Special *Parent Fly-Up Day* for 2nd and 3rd grade parents.
- The School received two "Make A Difference" grants from the Lake Forest/Lake Bluff Learning Differences Association. One of the grants allowed the school to purchase *Learning Ally*, and the other enabled the school to create a multi-sensory room for students at the UGC.
- Two new recruiting incentives were created: The *New Family Referral Program*, as well as a *Military Tuition Credit*.
- A set of twelve *Ozobot* robots were purchased earlier this year by our Parents' Association for each campus. Students at the PGC and UGC learned how to code using both *Color Specific Code*, which uses sensors on the robots, and *Blockly Code*.
- A number of 8th grade students traveled to Washington D.C. for a four-day tour of Washington, DC.
- Field trips included:
 - 8th Grade: Chicago Trip to Holy Name Cathedral, Soldier Field and architectural boat tour of downtown Chicago, St. Mary of the Lake Seminary and the Skokie Holocaust Museum
 - 7th Grade: Holy Fire Retreat and Old World Wisconsin field trip
 - 7th and 8th graders attended *The Vatican International Exhibit of the Eucharistic Miracles of the World*
 - 6th and 7th graders traveled to the Lyric Opera House and the American Writers Museum
 - 6th grade visited the North Shore Congregation Israel Synagogue
 - 5th graders went to *Openlands Lakeshore Preserve* and the Field Museum
 - 4th grade went to the Shedd Aquarium and the Milwaukee Public Museum
 - 3rd grade students went to *The Grove* in Glenview
 - 1st through 8th grade students and staff attended *Mary Poppins Returns* as a school community

Income Statement Financial Footnotes

THE ARCHDIOCESE OF CHICAGO & PARISH OF ST. MARY ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The Church of St. Mary's financial statements are prepared on the modified cash basis, which is a comprehensive basis other than generally accepted accounting principles in the United States of America (US GAAP). Under the modified cash basis of accounting, adjustments to the cash basis accounts are made to conform to certain Archdiocesan provisions. Revenues and expenses are recognized only as cash received or paid, except as for certain modifications specified by the Archdiocese. Prepaid tuition is recognized as a liability in the statements of financial position - modified cash basis, and the Parish endowment funds are recorded at fair value as provided by the Archdiocese. In addition, the Archdiocesan provisions require real property of the Parish to be held in trust by the Archdiocese of Chicago. Other land and buildings, such as rental properties and the Primary Grade Center land, are carried at cost by the Parish and are not depreciated.

{1} - Investments & Endowment Funds

The Church of St. Mary holds two endowment fund assets, each with a permanently restricted corpus and both held in charter with the Archdiocesan Bank. The Parish Educational Endowment Fund is restricted for educational use only by the Parish. The Parish can draw from the balance of temporarily restricted realized gains at any point in time to support the further education of children and adults alike through the Religious Education program, Evangelization, or the School. Changes in the balances are from pooled Investment gains or losses and donations received by the Church and deposited into the fund.

The Parish Scholarship Endowment Fund corpus was donated from an anonymous donor in 2007 for the purpose of supporting families with financial need in attending the School of St. Mary. Per the charter, only 5% of temporarily restricted realized gains can be withdrawn annually.

{5} - School of St. Mary Tuition & Financial Aid

- \$51,350 was received as tuition subsidy from St. Patrick's Church for 25 students that were parishioners of St. Patrick's who attended the School of St. Mary in FY2019.
- \$4,850 was received as tuition subsidy from Holy Cross Church for 4 students that were parishioners of Holy Cross who attended the School of St. Mary in FY2019.
- The Parish awarded \$34,650 in need-based financial aid in FY2019 to 13 students.
- \$53,920 was received from the Illinois Tax Credit Scholarship Program awarding financial aid to 8 students.
- \$3,720 of uncollected tuition from prior years was collected and recorded in income in the current year.

{6} - School of St. Mary Parents' Association Donations

A total of \$248,770 was donated by the School of St. Mary Parents' Association in FY2019 to the School of St. Mary and was designated for the following purposes:

- \$210,000 was donated to support School Operating Expenses (*Fundraising Net Income*)
- \$17,325 was donated for Academic Year 2018-2019 Financial Aid for need based families (*Tuition, Registration & Comprehensive Fees*)
- \$21,445 was donated from Parents' Association Prior Years' Surplus and was released for the restricted use of:
 - Primary & Upper Grade Center Epson Interactive Projectors
 - STEAM Lab Ozobot Technology (*Temporarily Restricted Release*)

{7} - Parish School & Religious Education Program Subsidies

The FY2019 Parish Subsidy of the School totaled \$633,423: \$270,400 subsidy, \$17,325 financial aid, \$297,698 operating shortfall, and a release of \$48,000 from the Parish Education Endowment Fund for School Staff Bonuses.

The FY2019 Parish Subsidy to the Religious Education program totaled \$58,474.

{8} - Archdiocesan Assessments

The Church of St. Mary pays four assessments to the Chicago Archdiocese annually:

Archdiocese Assessment

The Archdiocese Assessment is billed at 10% of the Church's income from operations (less interest) from FY2017 reported closed financials. This assessment positively impacts the Parish of St. Mary with supporting functions such as: financial, operational, legal, insurance, risk management, human resources, payroll, employee benefits, religious education as well as pastoral and liturgical functions.

Office of Catholic Schools Assessment (OCS)

The Office of Catholic Schools Assessment (OCS) is billed at a rate per student. The cost per student in FY2019 was \$25.00. The Office of Catholic Schools helps to support the School of St. Mary with services concerning human resources, legal, curriculum, instructional and educational needs.

Lease & License Assessment

The Archdiocese Lease & License Assessment is billed at 10% of lease ordinary income received by the Parish from residential home rental leases and room leases.

Priest Retirement Mutual Aid Association Assessment (PRMAA)

The PRMAA Assessment supports the retirement fund for our priests within the Chicago Archdiocese. The amount billed by PRMAA is 3.5% of the total church operating revenue (less interest) of FY2018 reported closed financials.

{9} - To Teach Who Christ Is FY2019 Income & Releases

\$120,967 of TTWCI Unrestricted Income was received in FY2019.

{10} - Estates & Bequests Income

The Parish was the benefactor of two Bequests in FY2019 for a total income of \$261,906.

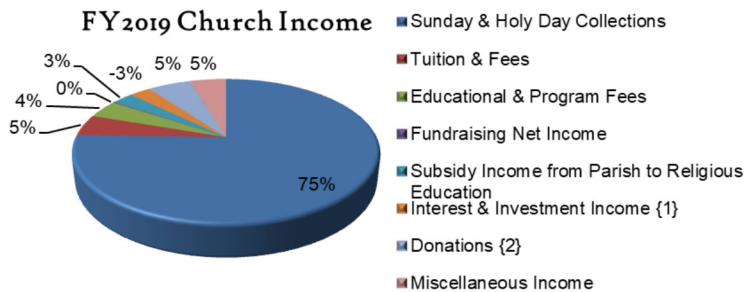

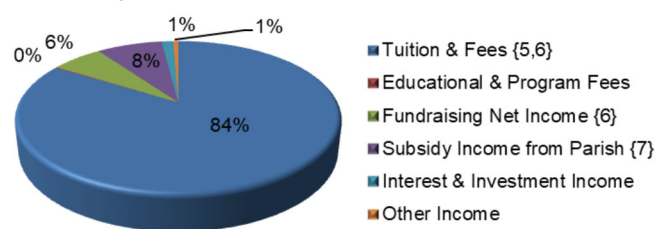

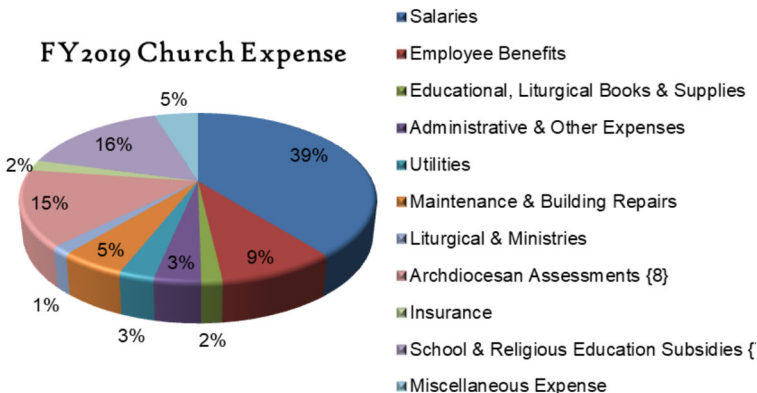
FY2019 Church Income



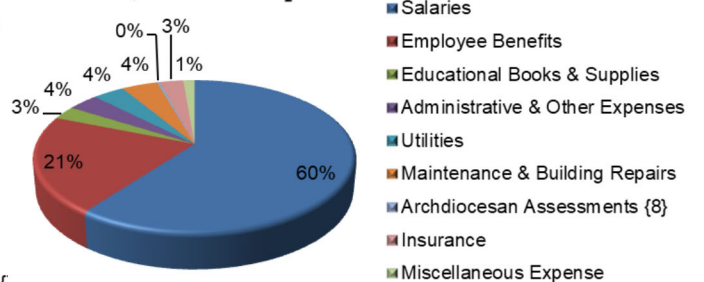
FY2019 School Income

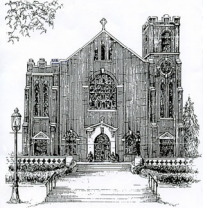


FY2019 Church Expense
