Recently, I received the PADS Lake County newsletter. There were some very interesting statistics they shared informing readers of what they have accomplished. Since the COVID-19 pandemic began, PADS Lake County has moved 1,257 people into permanent housing. (One of their top priorities is finding long term solutions for their guests.) Over 140,000 meals have been served due to the partners and volunteers. They have served over 2,000 people. Over 760 people received shelter from the elements; over 730 people have stayed safe in their own homes. They have engaged with over 150 people building relationships with anyone living outside to provide a path to housing. Thanks to all those who support Deacon Jack and his ministry to PADS Lake County on the second Friday of the month, providing meals for the guests of PADS from October through April each year.
