Happy 2nd Sunday of Advent!! May each and every one of us make time in our hearts, make time in our lives, make time on our calendars, to actively and prayerfully make room for spiritual growth in these days of **Advent waiting and Advent hope**.

The mom said, "It was the only way to get her to learn the prayer, by teaching her the hand gestures."
