Joyous Easter! Jesus our Lord and Savior is Risen!

They crucified Jesus on Good Friday! God would not allow death to be the final word, of His Son's life. Jesus is the Living Word of God. Jesus is Emmanuel – God with us. Life in Jesus turns our despair to hope, our darkness to light, and our sadness to joy. Jesus our Lord and Savior is Risen! Joyous Easter!

We welcome all those celebrating with us today. Perhaps you were at the Easter Vigil welcoming the newest members of our parish into the Church through the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist. Maybe you are standing in the back of the church singing Alleluia. Because of your faith and desire to live Easter, you may be in the gym of the Upper Grade Center, knowing that wherever we are, we are to live, share, and proclaim the hope of the Resurrection in our lives of faith.
