By passion and affinity, she would take delight in proofing the bulletin, informing me of typos and even occasionally proofing my article and communications to parishioners. Cal was very involved with Catholic Charities, even working at their Summer Golf Classic at Shore Acres.

She traveled on the Footsteps of St. Paul with her son, Mark, and her grandson, Mark Nate. She enjoyed the pilgrimage, even going out on a nighttime excursion following in the "Footsteps of her pastor", to find and enjoy gelato with her fellow pilgrims. She shared with me that at 90, she had earned her driver's license renewal, again. It was very important to her that I knew that. She had a bucket list, one item being going to Ephesus, Turkey. She took delight in the trip, and being able to share in the celebration of the Eucharist at the House of the Blessed Mother in Ephesus.



The pilgrims had a delightful pilgrimage, Cal was known to celebrate, smile, and laugh along the way, traveling with her son, grandson, and fellow parishioners. On day eight the schedule and demands of the pilgrimage caught up with her. Her body had a medical episode that warranted her being hospitalized, cared for, and kept an eye on by her son and grandson. After an eight day stay in the hospital, Cal Stroh breathed her last breath on Earth.

While on pilgrimage in May 2022, she shared with me that she would love to get to the Holy Land, spending time in Jerusalem. She also shared that she did not think it was a realistic goal. Cal was always praying, streaming the Masses during COVID, letting me know just how much she could
