## From the Desk of Fr. Mike



I strive to communicate with parishioners and benefactors of the Parish throughout the year. With the help of members of the Parish Finance Council, the Fiscal year 2021 annual report is being put together. We hope that it will be in parishioners hands in mid-November if not before. Over the summer I penned a letter to families with children in the School of St. Mary. Parts of that letter are included in my article this weekend.

The Church of St. Mary was founded in 1875; the School of St. Mary was opened in 1917. Over the decades, parishioners of St. Mary's have been generous in their stewardship. The continued generous stewardship of parishioners allows current generations of families to be educated in the

faith through the School of St. Mary and the Church of St. Mary Religious Education program. Parishioners are generous in their support of the parish in the offertory collection, in fundraising and remembering the Church of St. Mary in their final will and estate upon their death. I am writing to all of the parents of School of St. Mary students that are registered parishioners at the Church of St. Mary. Being part of a vibrant and generous faith community is enriched and strengthened by the continued commitment and support of all. May you recognize the many ways your actions add to and enhance the faith community of St. Mary's. May you be aware of the support and prayers of members of the parish for you and your family.

And I am writing to School families today, asking for your participation in supporting the Church of St. Mary through the offertory collection at Mass. I am asking you to review the level of support, the amount that you contribute weekly to the Church of St. Mary. I am asking you to prayerfully review and reflect on your church support as a reflection of your faith. Do you have joy in your heart as you review what you have contributed last year, over the past six months, this past summer? As you reflect in joy, are you and your family able to increase your regular contributions to the Church of St. Mary received in the offertory collection?

(The Church of St. Mary keeps records of all contributions received in a church envelope or by check or bank transfer. If you would like to know what we have recorded as contributions from you and your family, you may contact the Business Office. The parish sends tax statements to families in January for your use in filing your state and national taxes.) You commit to contributing to the Church of St. Mary by enrolling your students in the School, thus receiving the parishioner rate versus the non-parishioner tuition rate for the current year.

Over the years many people have been generous. Giving back to God with joy and gratitude is a beautiful expression of one's faith. I would hope that all past, present and future donors and benefactors of the Church of St. Mary would always give and return to God with a joyous heart, knowing that maintaining and improving our buildings, schools, church, and campus are ways that we pay forward so that our children and grandchildren may be recipients of what we have received because of past generosity of parishioners since the founding of the Church of St. Mary. May God always bless those who give to the support of the local and universal Church.

I am including in my article dates that have been shared in previous bulletins and e-blasts from the Church of St. Mary. November 1 is the Feast of All Saints, originally called "Martyr's Day". It wasn't until the 7<sup>th</sup> century that the Church changed the feast to be the Feast of All Saints! In the early Church the first Christians were martyred for their faith. You are invited to a Holy Hour for Vocations on Wednesday, November 3, during the regular scheduled time that we offer adoration at the Church of St. Mary: Wednesday, November 3 from 5:00pm – 7:00pm.
