This coming Thursday, October 7, the Roman Catholic Church celebrates the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary. All are invited to attend the 7:30am Mass and pray the rosary this Thursday.

With the guidance of the Parish Finance Council and support of the Parish Council, we regularly address maintenance and capital projects that maintain and improve our campus. After a long delay, this week began the much needed tuck pointing of St. Mary's church. It took several months for the bricks to arrive for the project. The tuck pointing helps keep nature outside of the church and allows the beauty of the interior to remain intact.

Here is some information regarding the tuck pointing project at our parish. The work will take place on the southwest, south, southeast, and northeast sides/corners of the church. There should be no impact to the North Front Doors. The lift and materials will be stationed in the southwest corner of the Green Bay Road parking lot next to the UGC Gym and close to the Green Bay Road entrance. There will be times the construction crew will need to block the Green Bay Road entrance when moving the lift/materials. A small construction protective canopy will be built over the South Entrance to the church to protect parishioners. It is our goal to keep the South Doors open as much as possible, but we may have to close them during parts of the day when they start to work on the South façade. We will keep you updated as to the progress made on this and other maintenance projects as they unfold. Weather will dictate the length of the tuck pointing project at the parish this fall.

Next Saturday we are recognizing couples celebrating their 25th wedding anniversary. Couples will attend the 5:00pm Mass and receive a blessing on the occasion of their Silver Anniversary. Since we were not able to gather couples together in 2020, if you celebrated your silver wedding anniversary last year, please call the Parish Office and let us know if you can attend the Mass on Saturday. We would be very happy to include you.
